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



Teacher: Teach the children about family and the different members of the family. Invite them to color the portrait.

Baby and Adult
















Teacher: Explain the difference between adult and baby. Have the children match the pictures of adults and babies.



Young and Old










Teacher: Teach the children about growing up and what it means to be young and old. Have the children draw a circle around the young people and a rectangle around the old people.


Teacher: Teach the children how to say how old they are in response to the question "How old are you?" Have them write the number of their age on the line and color that number of balloons in their favorite color.



Who is old? Who is young?










Teacher: Review what it means to be old and young. Instruct them to circle the young person in each of the pairs of pictures.




Mother's Day
