
Drink



Teacher: Teach eat and drink to the children. Show them the pictures to see the difference. Instruct them to color the pictures.









Teacher: Instruct the children to match the picture of the food or drink with the picture of eating or drinking. Have them color the things you eat red and the things you drink blue.



Food Shapes



Teacher: Review shapes with the children. Have them draw a line between the shape and the food that is like that shape. Then, they can color the food.



Teacher: Explain that people celebrate Thanksgiving in November to show how thankful they are for what they have. Try to explain this in simplest terms, i.e. to be thankful is to show you are happy for something. Tell them we eat turkey as part of a big feast on Thanksgiving Day. Instruct them to color the turkey.



Peter, Peter pumpkin eater, Had another and didn't love her; Peter learned to read and spell, And then he loved her very well.




Teacher: Teach this nursery rhyme. Use it to review the letter p and words they may know such as eat. Encourage the children to practice at home.

Teacher: Teach "I'm a Little Teapot" using the actions. Review the difference between eat and drink. Encourage the students to practice at home.





"Br'er Rabbit's Christmas"
